

# **Care Experienced Students**

The information on this page is for young people who are thinking of applying to Warwick as an Undergraduate student for 2025 entry and are <u>care experienced</u>. If you are planning to apply elsewhere, we would encourage you to contact your university choices to see what support is available to you.

### 1. Care Experienced definition

If you are 'Care Experienced', this means that you have been looked after for at least <u>3 months</u> at any point in your childhood. This care may have been provided in many different settings, including:

- Living with foster carers
- Living in a residential children's home
- Being looked after at home under a supervision order
- Living with relatives under a guardianship agreement

If you were in the care of your local authority for at least 13 weeks at any time since the age of 14, and were in care on your 16th birthday, please take a look at our <u>information for Care Leavers</u> or if you are not in contact with both of your parents (known as 'estranged'), please go to our <u>Independent students</u> <u>who are estranged</u> webpage.

### 2. Applying to University

Students apply to university through the UCAS application form. This form includes your personal details, personal circumstances (this is where you can tell your university choices that you have been in care), educational history, predicted grades (where applicable), your course choices, your personal statement and your reference.

We would encourage you to tick the 'care experienced' tick-box on the UCAS form so that your university choices are notified of your circumstances and can offer you appropriate support, information and guidance. You can find out more about this tick-box online <a href="here">here</a>.

#### **Evidence**

The universities you apply to may ask you to provide evidence of your care experience so that appropriate support can be arranged for you. At Warwick, we advise students to provide evidence in their UCAS reference (i.e. your referee confirming your circumstances in their written reference). If the university requires more information from you, we will contact you directly.

### 3. Applying for Student Finance

You can apply to Student Finance England (or the equivalent awarding body in Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland) for financial support with your tuition fees and living costs.

**Tuition Fee Loans:** These loans are paid directly to your university.

**Maintenance Loans:** These loans are means-tested (based on your household income) and are paid to you.

To apply for financial support, you will need to complete an online application form and submit details of your household income (usually your parent's/guardian's income). If you are a care leaver or you are estranged from both of your parents, you can be assessed as an 'independent student' instead.
