

Details of the programmes

- Core events (6-7 events in year 12, 2 in year 13) 60% pass rate
- Optional events
- Blended approach with online events and on campus events
- Travel booking support
- Those who secure a place on either programme are expected to attend all compulsory events throughout Year 12 and Year 13. Where possible, we are planning all events in the afternoons (4pm onwards). Where not possible, some events may take place during holidays or weekends.

Am I eligible to apply?

Who can apply?

Students applying to Pathways to Law must meet the following criteria:

- ▶ Attend, and have always attended, a state-funded, non fee-paying school/college
- ▶ Be in Year 12 at the start of the programme
- ▶ Live within a reasonable commuting distance of the university you are applying to. This will normally be one hour's travel time each way.

In addition, we are looking for students who:

- ▶ Have achieved in the region of 5 GCSE's at grades 9-6 (A*-B) with a minimum of 2 A* or A grades, including grades 9 - 6 in Mathematics and English
- ▶ Would be the first generation in their family to attend university
- ▶ Have been in receipt of Free School Meals whilst at secondary school
- ▶ Have attended schools with a lower than average progression to Higher Education, or a higher than average proportion of students who qualify for Free School Meals
- ▶ Live in a neighbourhood with a low rate of progression to higher education or a high level of socio-economic deprivation
- ▶ Have been looked after, in care or a young carer
- ▶ **For Engineering only** - Currently studying A level Maths and /or Physics.

The more criteria you meet, the more likely you are to be offered a place on the programme.

- Application deadlines:
 - 27th October – Law & Banking
 - 3rd November – Engineering
- You will receive a decision within 2 weeks of applications closing, hold launch date in diary
