Introduction

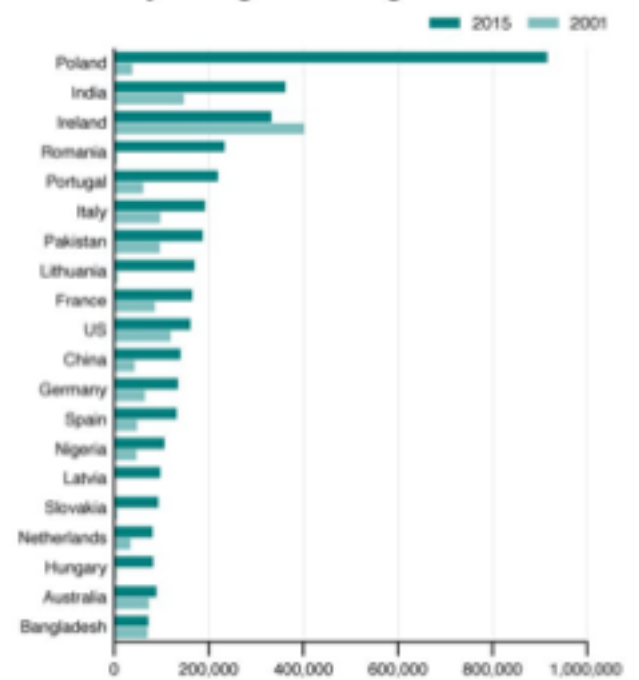
Migration

Rise in violent crime.

10.4% increase in violent crimes in Lower Saxony (Germany), 92.1% of increase attributed to immigrants. (2015-16)

Increase of share of violent crimes from 4.3% to 13.3% (2014-2016)

Brain Drain

Immigration of highly skilled workers from poorer areas to richer areas; this deprives the home countries of these migrants of tools to escape poverty and develop.
