The University of Warwick strives to build a safe, positive and inclusive culture and environment for all. Our expectations around participants' conduct remain the same as it would for an in-person event throughout the summer school.

This document provides participants with clear expectation and guidelines to ensure that everyone who takes part in the Summer School understands the boundaries of appropriate behaviour in order for all to enjoy safely the experience.

Expected behaviour

Everyone involved in the Summer School must take responsibility for the consequences of their behaviour. All comments posted will be visible and we reserve the right to withdraw your access if the comments you are posting are deemed inappropriate

Equality

All young people and staff involved in the Summer School deserve to be treated with fairness and respect. Treat others as you would like to be treated.

Anti-Bullying

Bullying will not be tolerated whether in person or online. No-one should make derogatory comments about another person's appearance, race, culture, sexuality, gender or disability. Be aware of your own behaviour and how it may be perceived by others.

Online Safety

We want you to fully engage with the summer school experience and contribute to a positive and safe environment.

We expect you to:

- sign into the sessions at least 10 minutes before the start to ensure that all your equipment is working
- use appropriate language when engaging in sessions and submitting question to facilitators ahead of time
- have other devices on silent / off when taking part in group sessions
- minimise distractions and disruptions by closing other documents and online content while taking part in the sessions and if possible, wearing headphones.
- not record any of the sessions being delivered digitally unless specifically told to do so.
- protect your own privacy by having a neutral background. In addition, be mindful of the environment you are in when in a group session with your video on. Ensure you have nothing personal or sensitive in view.
- not give out your last name, phone number, address, photographs or other details about yourself within a public setting
- · not interfere with other people's work, which may result in it being changed, vandalised, lost or deleted
- not email or message the student ambassadors directly but only use the group chat functions during online events
