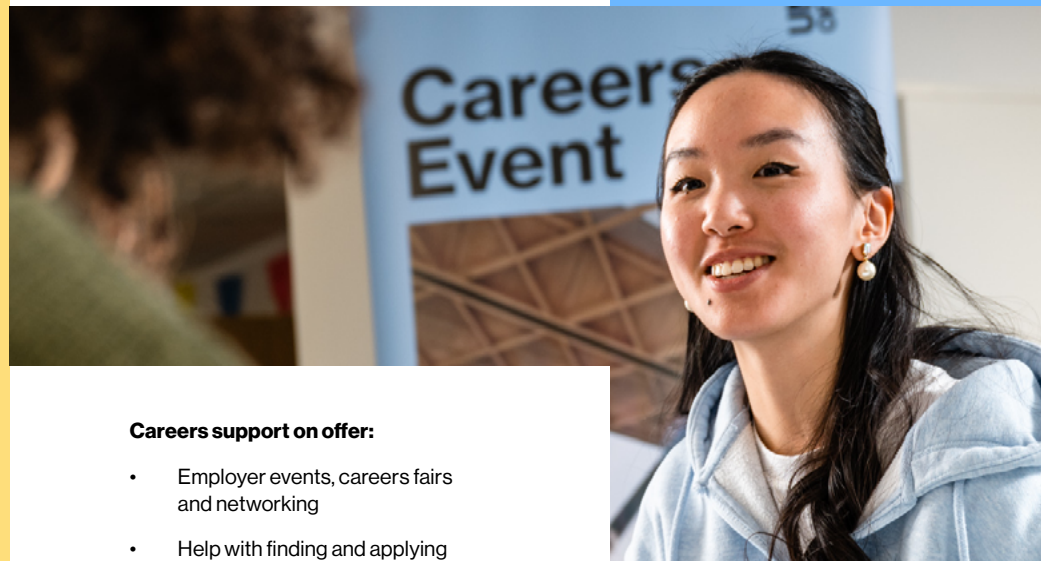

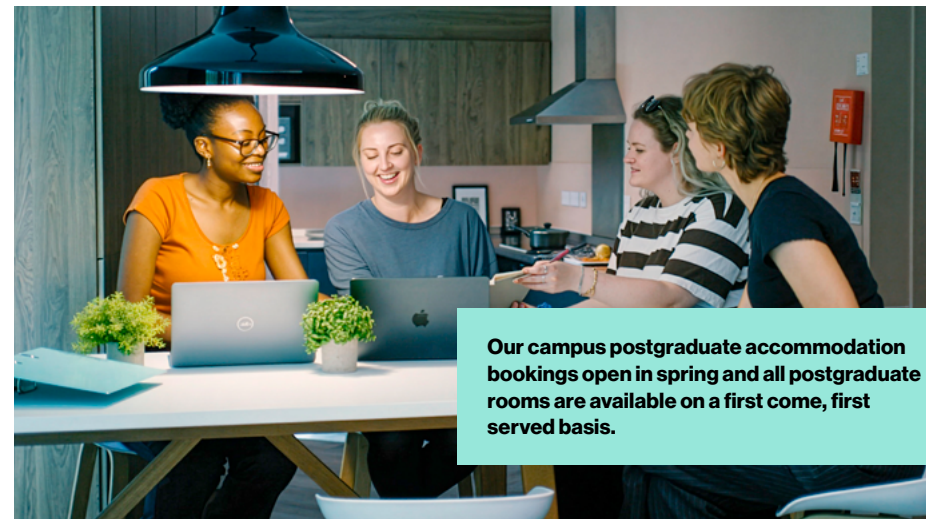

Student spotlight

Sai Shinde

Since joining Warwick, Sai has embraced every aspect of postgraduate life, from academic and professional development to becoming part of a vibrant community. Here, she shares the experiences that have shaped her journey so far.

Please can you tell us what postgraduate degree you are studying, why did you choose Warwick, and what made this course the right fit for you?

I'm studying MSc Behavioural and Economic Science, a multidisciplinary degree with modules across Psychology, Economics, and Warwick Business School. That breadth was exactly what I was looking for, and no other programme offered it in quite the same way.

What has been the most rewarding or interesting part of your postgraduate experience so far?

It's hard to pinpoint one moment, but the people stand out above everything else. Friends and professors are genuinely invested in your success, and that warmth has made the whole experience feel worthwhile.

Can you tell us about a project, opportunity, or experience at Warwick that has had a particularly positive impact on you?

Serving as Head of Outreach for the Warwick Behavioural Insights Team has been one of the most enriching experiences of my time here. It pushed me into territory I had never explored before, and bringing in industry experts created value not just for me but for the wider student community.

Did you know we offer pre-sessional English courses that may help you to meet our English language requirements? warwick.ac.uk/presessional

Check the application deadline(s)

Check the course webpage for any specific deadlines. Otherwise, for most courses that start in September/October 2027:

- ☑ Applications open in Autumn 2026
- ☑ Deadline for students who require a visa to study in the UK is the 2 August 2027

For Research courses that start at other times of year we recommend applying at least:

- ☑ 3 months before the course start date if you require a visa to study in the UK
- ☑ 6 weeks before the course start date if you do not require a visa to study in the UK

Check the course fees and explore funding options

You'll need to think about the course fees as well as living costs.

There are lots of funding routes available, including loans, scholarships and bursaries, as well as considering part-time work opportunities to support you in your studies.

For Taught:

Write your personal statement

This should be 1-2 pages long, in English and in your own words. Find more top tips in our guide to writing your personal statement: warwick.ac.uk/personalstatement

For Research:

Contact your department, potential supervisor(s) and/or write your research proposal (if required)

For research degrees you must locate a suitable supervisor for your area of research, and we recommend contacting them before you submit your application.

Specific requirements for this step can differ by department. Find details for each department at warwick.ac.uk/pg/apply

Prepare any additional information and supporting documents

We typically ask for:

- ☑ Transcripts from your university-level study (current or completed)
- ☑ Degree certificate (if study has been completed)
- ☑ English language proficiency (if applicable and available)
- ☑ Personal statement (taught courses only) or Research proposal (research courses only, if applicable)
- ☑ CV/resume (if applicable)
- ☑ Academic referee contact details

You may find it helpful to save these in one place before you start your application.

Pay the application assessment fee (if prompted)

Scholarships and financial support

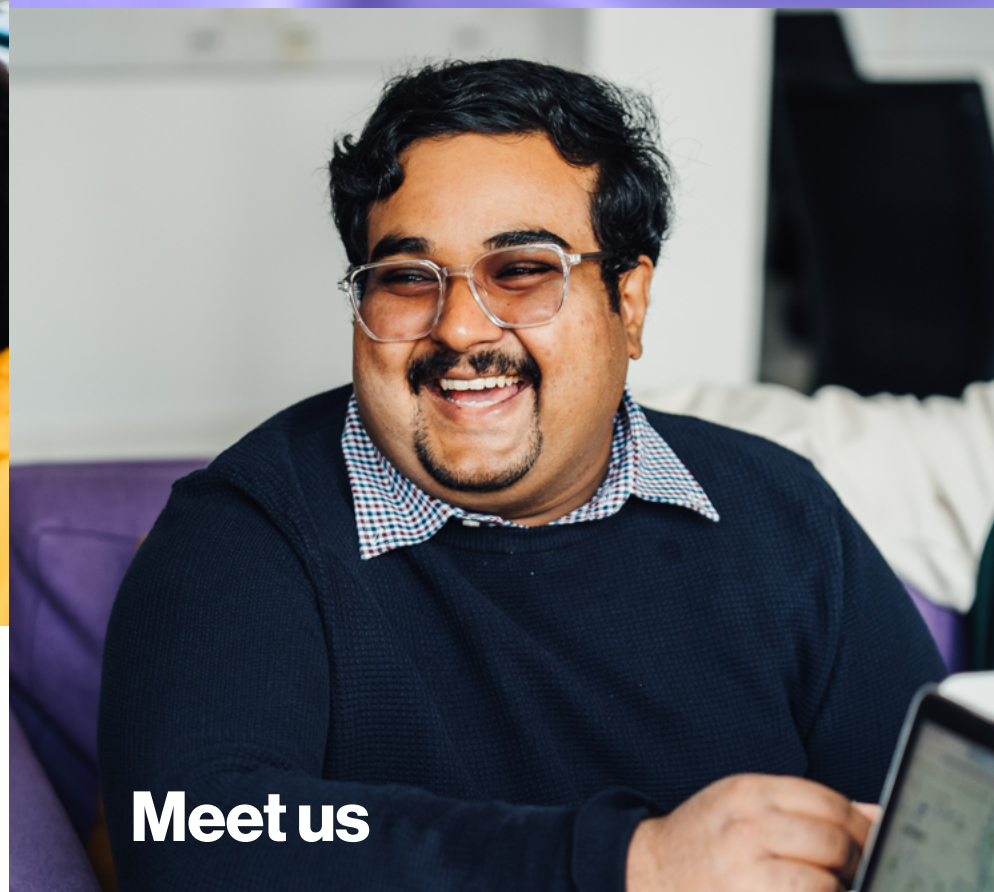
Depending on your circumstances, you could access:

Entry Requirements

You can find individual course entry
requirements, including international qualification
equivalencies, on the course webpages.

The university's minimum postgraduate entry
requirement is a 2:2 undergraduate degree
(or international equivalent).

Some courses may require a higher level of
achievement and/or prior study in a related
subject, but we welcome applicants from a
wide range of academic backgrounds.

Course Durations

The time over which a course can be studied
varies by course. As an indication:

- Taught Master's courses, e.g. MA or MSc qualifications, are typically offered 1 year if full-time or 2 years if part-time.
- Research Master's courses, e.g. MRes qualifications, are also typically studied for 1 year if full-time or 2 years if part-time.
- Research degrees, e.g. PhDs, are typically studied for 3-4 years full-time, and up to 7 years part-time depending on the make-up of the course.

From arriving at Warwick as an international student studying MSc Marketing & Strategy to graduating top of her cohort and launching a career in TikTok Shop marketing in London, Nadia Samad reflects on the experiences that shaped her journey.



“

I came hoping to land on my feet and left wanting to run

When you started your postgraduate degree, who did you hope to become and how has that vision evolved?

Honestly? I came in hoping to survive, navigate a new country, get the degree, figure out the rest. I had ambitions but I kept them quietly, because starting over somewhere new has a way of making you hedge. What I didn't expect was how quickly Warwick would make me expand what I thought was possible. Between the academic rigour, the part-time opportunities on campus, the sheer volume of things happening around you every week there's no version of Warwick where you stay small. I came in hoping to land on my feet. I left wanting to run. The vision didn't just evolve, it got significantly bolder than I'd allowed myself to plan for.

Was there a particular experience at Warwick that had a lasting impact?

The part-time opportunities on campus stand out the most. I did two – a content creator role for the university where I was producing real content for real audiences, and a project officer role for the Inclusive Education Conference where I was coordinating speakers, running multichannel campaigns, and delivering something that actually mattered institutionally. I came out with a portfolio, with stakeholder experience, and with the kind of quiet confidence that only comes from having actually done the work. If I were talking to someone considering Warwick I'd say, don't just show up for the degree. The stuff happening around it is where a lot of the real growth is.

How did your postgraduate experience shape the professional and person you are today?

I didn't come to Warwick as a blank slate. I came with two years of work experience across policy and marketing in India. What I needed wasn't a starting point – it was a sharpening. A way to take everything I'd built and make it land in a completely new market. Warwick gave me exactly that.

The academic challenges pushed me further than I anticipated, far enough that I ended up topping my cohort, and the part-time opportunities on campus meant I was applying things in real time rather than just in theory. I came in already driven. I left with the clarity and the confidence to back myself in rooms that didn't know me yet and that's probably the thing no module can formally teach you, but Warwick somehow does anyway.

If you could speak to someone considering a postgraduate degree at Warwick, what would you tell them?

Stop trying to feel settled and just let it be unsettled for a bit. The discomfort isn't a sign you made the wrong decision, it's the whole point. The version of you that comes out the other side is worth the turbulence to get there. Warwick will push you, the campus will surprise you, the weather will be worse than you prepared for and none of that will matter when you look back at what you built. Come ready to work. Leave ready for anything.
