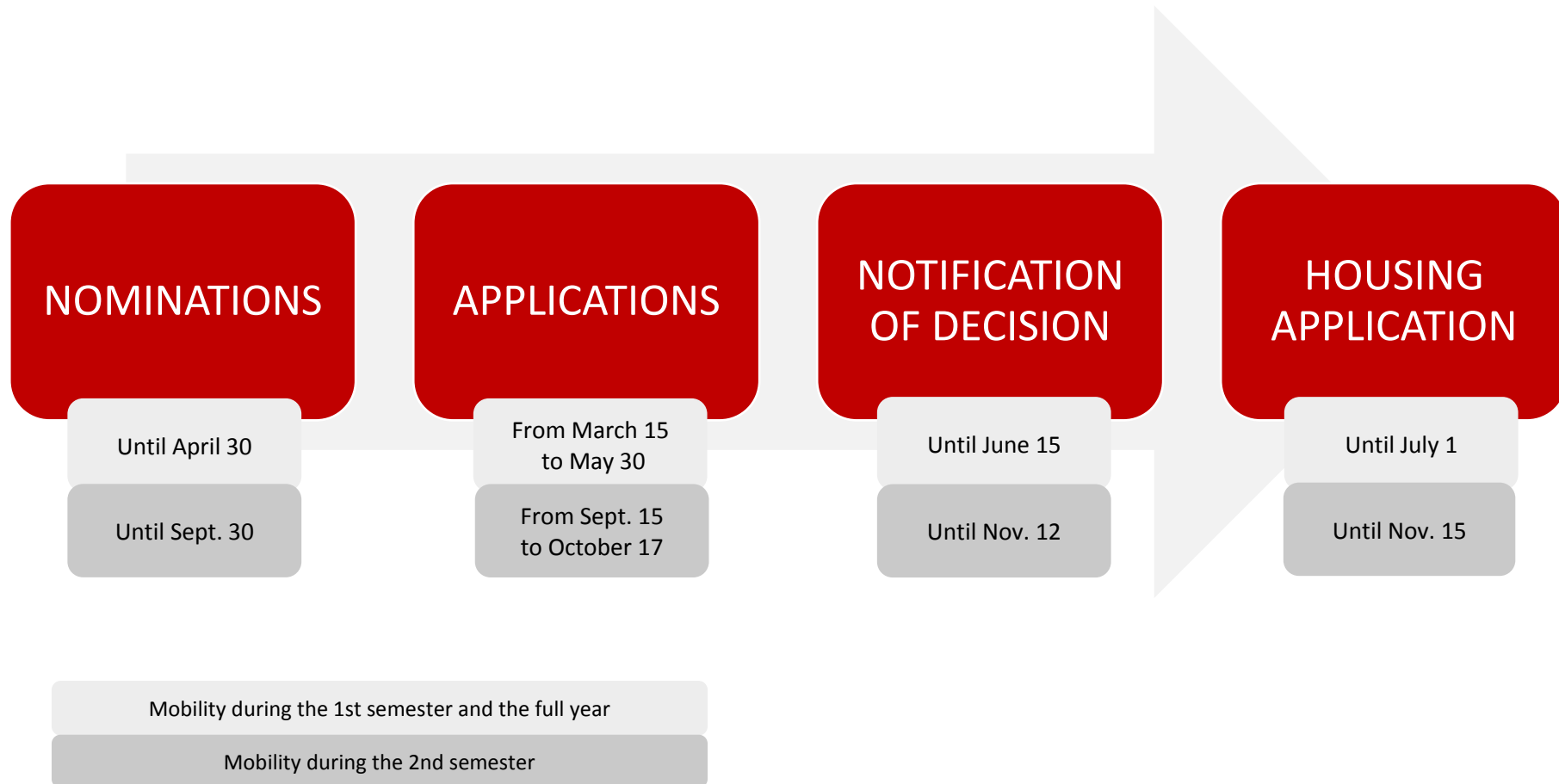

## HOUSING

### Student housing

- In [residence hall of the CROUS](#):  
from 150 to 430 € / month  
excluding charges
  - 9m<sup>2</sup> room: **Shared washrooms** /Bed, desk, wardrobe/closet, shelves, chair, washbasin, shared kitchen):  
From €160 to €180/ month
  - 12-20m<sup>2</sup> room: **private shower, toilet and washbasin**/Bed, desk, wardrobe/closet, shelves, shelves, chair / Privatekitchenette): From €360/month
  - Studio : From €430/month
- In private student residence:  
Students may elect to live in private housing; costs in Grenoble range from 250 to 840 € / month.
- Rental of a studio (private rental park): about from 350 € +/ month
- Room in a shared flat: about 400 €
- Renting a room with the inhabitant (private rental park): about 280 € / month

Students do not have to contact directly the student housing department, They will receive an automatic email of the process to apply for housing.

**Be careful: to respect the procedure that will be sent and check spams**

Exchange students who complete the housing application process by the deadlines indicated are guaranteed a proposal of place in housing for students. They won't be asked for a French guarantor.

**Note:** If the student will be lodged in a residence CROUS, the arrival to the residence must be scheduled until the 8th day of the month.

Students who apply after the housing deadline may still be able to live in university housing if places are still available.

## IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS

### Visas And Residence Permits

Depending on your nationality, you are exempted from obtaining a visa to enter metropolitan France and the [Schengen area](#).  
Students residing outside the Schengen area should apply for a visa as soon as possible. Admitted students should begin the visa process as soon as possible. The letter will be sent by the international relations office of the host faculty.

## HEALTH INSURANCE

### Health Insurance

- Residents of European Economic Community (EEC): the [European health insurance card](#) valid during the entire period of their mobility
  - Quebec residents: the form RAMQ N°SE 401Q106.
  - If you are not concerned by the two previous situations, you will have to subscribe to the French student insurance at the time of the registration and pay about 217€ (2017-18). Please refer to the practical sheet [Social Security in France](#).  
**Exceptions:**
    - Students staying less than 90 days are not considered residents, and do not need to enroll.
    - Students 28 years of age or older cannot enroll in the *sécurité sociale*.  
Students in these cases may be able to enroll in the French national health care system should they so desire. Such students should speak with a university staff member when they arrive.
- Please note:** emergency medical evacuation is not covered by the *sécurité sociale*. Students are strongly encouraged to verify that their home insurance covers this eventuality.
