## Why Warwick?

The University of Warwick is a top Russell Group University widely recognised as a world leader in research and education.

You can choose from four courses taught by top Warwick faculty, who are passionate about their subjects and sharing their knowledge with our Summer School students.

The University of Warwick is ranked in the top ten in major league tables in the UK and is ranked 8th in the UK in the Guardian University Guide 2025. It is one of Europe's top 20 universities and is 69th in the world. (2024 QS World Ranking)

Warwick has also been awarded Gold in all categories in the government's latest Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF) rankings.

We have a world-class campus with outstanding teaching and learning spaces, a 24-hour library, Arts centre and cinema, brand new sports centre, restaurants and cafes, and many green spaces including lakes, woodland, open fields. All of which you will be able to explore and enjoy during our Pre-University Summer School.

# Pre-University Summer School 2025 course options

Taught by Warwick staff, our courses are packed with lectures and seminars, a guest speaker, sessions on applying to study in the UK and personal development skills workshops.

No matter which course you choose, they have all been designed to include personal development sessions to enhance your skills and lots of experiences which will help you to prepare for studying in the UK. You should go away feeling more confident and more prepared having gained invaluable insights.

There are no subject specific requirements for the courses, but you should be enthusiastic about the academic content and considering applying to (or have already applied to) university. At the end of the course, all students will receive a certificate of attendance from The University of Warwick.

## A Taste of Economics and Finance

The programme covers exciting and important topics that lie at the heart of economics and finance. In addition to learning about core economic principles, you will also be introduced to areas such as game theory and behavioural economics, issues concerning the world of money and banking, core ideas of finance and stock markets, as well as political and social contexts, drawing on topical examples from the world around us. Topics covered will include finance in the 21st Century, with time to consider the impact of cryptocurrency, the global climate crises and financial stability, as well as artificial intelligence and the impact of machine learning on stock exchanges and financial institutions. This course will show you how to think like an economist and provide a perspective about the way economics is taught at university level in the UK.

## A Taste of Social Sciences

This course will give you an introduction to five of our top subjects at Warwick; Law, Philosophy, Sociology, Politics and Education Studies. In Law you will learn about how laws are made, who makes them and why they look the way they do. Philosophy will impart important skills and abilities in critical reasoning and reflection to help you progress in answering big questions about what kind of rights there are and when someone does or doesn't have a right - for instance, whether children have a right to be loved.

The Politics session will look at the ethics and political theory of climate change, thinking about how future generations should be involved in decision-making about climate change. In the Education Studies lectures, you will consider education as an instrument for social mobility, and why education is so important to a global society.

And with the wide scope of sociology encompassing the main markers of social difference in modern society - class, gender, 'race', ethnicity, age and (dis)ability - your lecture from the Sociology Department will be focused on one of our lecturer's areas of research and teaching interests.

## A Taste of Science and Engineering

On our Science and Engineering course, you will sample a range of disciplines at the centre of Warwick's science and engineering undergraduate offer; Engineering, Computer Science, Life Sciences, Psychology, and Mathematics. The Engineering session will focus on the subdiscipline of materials and those materials which form the backbone of automotive and civil engineering. In Computer Science, you will cover basic concepts about digital and embedded systems and how they can be used to automate processes - you'll be introduced to microcontrollers, electronic devices and software programming, and how they interact.

The Life Sciences introduction will look at the events that led to the entry of plague into Europe, the complex epidemiology of the bacterium that gave such a high death rate, before looking at recent developments. You'll have the opportunity to uncover the secrets of the human mind in the Psychology taster, discovering the techniques used by psychological scientists, and looking at the brain and body structures that make us act the way we do. In the Mathematics and Statistics elements, you'll look at how these subjects have evolved over time, and consider their importance and relevance today, thanks to the influence of various mathematicians.

## Taste of Arts and Humanities

This course will give you a taste of some of the exciting Arts and Humanities subjects on offer at Warwick. Teaching includes modules from English and Theatre, Film and TV, and Liberal Arts.

You'll dive into real-world, pressing global issues while exploring innovative ideas and perspectives. Beyond gaining knowledge in the module areas, you'll sharpen your analytical thinking, problem-solving, and communication skills—abilities that will be critical in a wide range of industries and careers. Whether you're passionate about creativity, storytelling, or tackling complex challenges, this course will inspire you to think deeply and make a meaningful impact.





## Personal Development

Our Personal Development sessions will allow you to focus on important skills such as effective listening, note-making, research skills and delivering presentations – all of which will be required for you to get the most out of university learning. The sessions will complement your academic learning so you will get an opportunity to apply some of the new knowledge you have learnt in an interactive way. On the final day of the academic course, you will work in small teams to deliver a presentation to the wider group.

## Preparing for University in the UK

Each course also includes two practical sessions which will help you in preparing for further study in the UK. There will be a session on applying to university in the UK and how the admissions process works, as well as a useful workshop on writing a Personal Statement. We will help you to consider what universities are looking for in your application, and how you can showcase yourself effectively through a personal statement.

## Guest Lecture

On the Pre-University Summer School, you'll also benefit from an exciting guest lecture, designed to broaden your education, insights and views as well as offering you a chance to engage with the speaker, ask questions and debate the topics they discuss.

# Experience university life

With our programme, you will not only gain further understanding and new academic perspectives, but you will also get a real taste of university life by living on the beautiful and self-contained Warwick campus.

Our induction programme includes a full campus tour for you to get acquainted with your surroundings. The Warwick campus has everything you need to make you feel at home.

## Accommodation

During your time on campus, you will live in our Sherbourne residences, alongside your Summer School Ambassadors. Sherbourne offers large en-suite rooms, modern kitchens, and comfortable communal areas for you to relax in. Single-sex or mixed-sex flat options are available.

## Outdoor spaces

Warwick has a huge amount of green space including lakes, woodlands and open fields, an outdoor activity zone and lots of wildlife too (including our famous campus cat!). There will be plenty of spare time in the evenings for you to explore.

## Sports facilities

Warwick's Sports and Wellness Hub is an incredible space for all abilities. Facilities include a 230-station gym, a 25-meter, 12-lane swimming pool, squash courts, climbing wall and a full timetable of fitness classes! As a Pre-University Summer School student, you will have swim and gym access included in your fee.

## Food and drink

Our social programme events include a variety of menus from BBQs and Street Food, to Indian-inspired food to keep things exciting and varied. As part of your tuition fee, all breakfasts and evening meals are provided, but there will be some occasions where you'll need to purchase your own lunches. Warwick has a variety of cafes, restaurants, as well as a small supermarket for you to buy lunches and any additional snacks and treats.





# Social and cultural activities

The course will keep students busy academically but we want to ensure that you also have an opportunity to enjoy your time on campus and experience many of the UK's cultural highlights with your new friends.

The programme includes a number of evening socials, including a welcome event incorporating fun team building activities, a curry and karaoke night and an evening of games and entertainment off-campus at a local fun and unique venue.

## Oxford

We will be visiting the historic and beautiful city of Oxford, home to the world-famous Oxford University, stunning architecture, the Bodleian Library, Ashmolean Museum and much more.

We'll spend the day there, and you will take part in a walking tour which will take you past some of the most famous colleges and monuments in Oxford, and a peek at some of the various locations used in the Harry Potter films. You'll also enjoy a guided punt (boat ride) along the River Cherwell taking in sights such as Christ Church College Meadows where Lewis Carroll wrote the famous Alice Through the Looking Glass, St Hilda's College, the Magdalen School Rose Gardens and the Botanic Gardens.

There will also be some free time for you to get lunch, explore at your own pace and do a little shopping!

## London

You will spend a day in the UK's capital.

We will travel there early to maximise the day and have an exciting programme of sightseeing\* with the opportunity to see some world-famous landmarks including:

- // A sightseeing boat tour along the River Thames
- // Free time in Covent Garden to see the architecture and street performers, and a chance for shopping and to get some lunch
- // A tour of one of the capital's 'must see attractions', the London Dungeons or a West End Show Matinee (previously we've seen The Lion King, Wicked and Matilda)
- // Dinner in a West End restaurant

All travel to and from London including travel in the city is included in the programme, along with listed activities entrance fees, and breakfast and dinner. Students are accompanied on the trip by our Summer School Ambassadors.

# Summer School Ambassadors

A key part of the programme is our fantastic team of Summer School Ambassadors, who are all existing Warwick students.

Our previous summer school students have told us that one of the main highlights of the programme was the opportunity to spend time with their ambassadors and learn from them about life as a student at Warwick.

## What do our ambassadors do?

We select our ambassadors from across the University faculties to give you a true insight into Warwick life. We have had ambassadors from many different departments including Warwick Business School, Politics and International Studies, Engineering, and Chemistry. Our mentors are selected through a rigorous process and can offer you informal advice on university subject choices, extracurricular activities, internships, volunteering and taking a year abroad.

Each student on the Pre-University Summer School is allocated an ambassador (one Summer School Ambassador per group of 12 students). A key part of the ambassadors' role is safeguarding and well-being, and making sure that you are happy on our campus. They'll live alongside you in halls of residence offering 24-hour support; they are trained in safe-guarding, emergency first aid and are also fully DBS\* checked. They also contribute to the social programme, and as well as accompanying you on the off-campus trips and to the formal social events, they arrange lots of informal entertainment and activities outside of the lecture room too to help you relax and feel at home on campus.

In the past these activities have included scavenger hunts across campus, board and card game evenings, sports tournaments, as well as group projects aimed at helping pre-university students develop their soft skills.

## Safety, security and wellbeing

During the Warwick Pre-University Summer School, students will be looked after by a core team of staff trained in safeguarding students of this age. Key staff involved in the delivery of the Summer School will also be fully DBS\* checked. Students will be provided with emergency contact details of Warwick staff and support services who will be contactable throughout the programme. The Warwick campus is a safe-space, and the University takes campus security very seriously with our Community Safety team working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week protecting the wellbeing of students.

# Admissions

## Entry criteria

Students applying for this programme must be aged 16-17 at the time of the Summer School. There are no subject-specific criteria, but you should be a passionate and enthusiastic learner.

## Fees

£4,950 (inclusive of a £1,000 deposit, required to secure place)

The fee includes accommodation for 10 nights, breakfasts, dinners (evening meals), refreshments, the social programme, all academic and skills teaching, the guest lectures, travel to London and Oxford, and all the activities on trips.

## English language requirements

All teaching is conducted in English so students must be able to demonstrate a good level of English language and comprehension. We assess students' English ability through their application and correspondence.

## Visas

You may require a visa to study in the UK for the Pre-University Summer School - if you do, you will need to apply via the Standard Visitor Route. Full guidance is available on our website, and we'll also issue eligible students with visa invitation letters as part of the admissions process.

## Applications

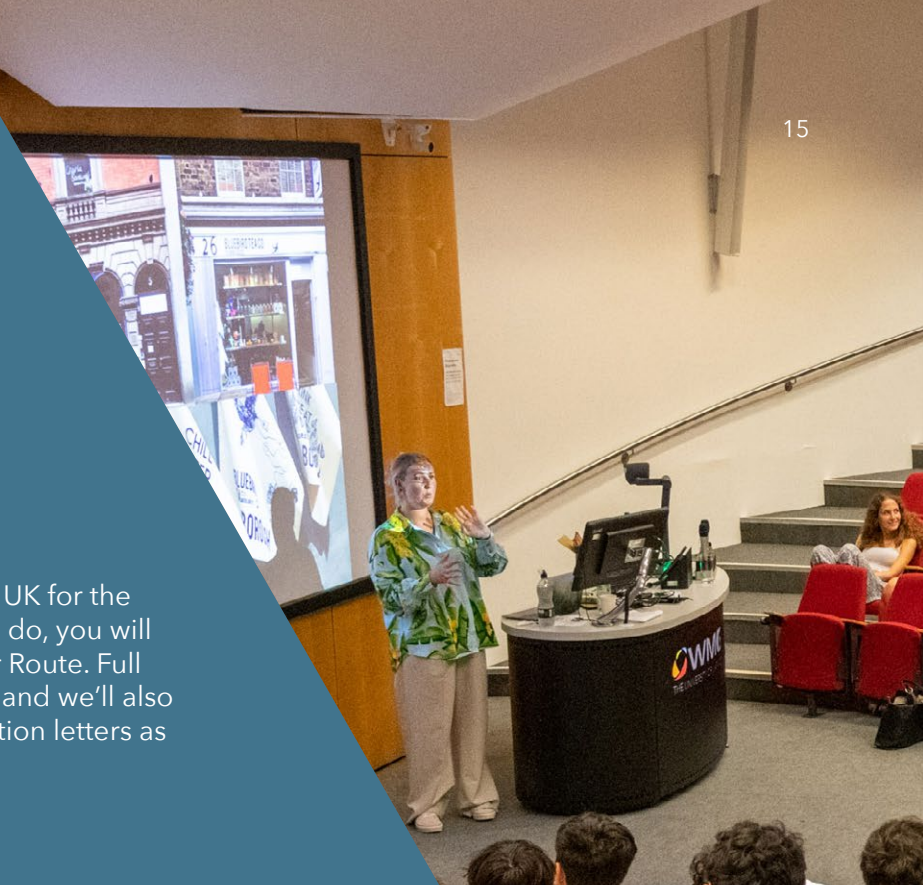
You can apply online, using our short application form. We'll ask for some of your details and education information and which course you'd like to apply for. We try to make decisions within 3-5 working days and all correspondence will be via email. A £50 application fee applies.
