THE COURSES

Taught by Warwick staff, our courses are packed with lectures, seminars and personal effectiveness workshops. This programme is designed to give students the chance to test-drive University-style teaching, expand their knowledge and skills and enthuse them about future study.

WE OFFER TWO STREAMS AS PART OF THE SUMMER SCHOOL

INTRODUCTION TO ECONOMICS AND FINANCE

The programme covers a number of exciting and important topics that lie at the heart of economics and finance. In addition to learning about core economic principles, our pre-university students will also be introduced to some exciting areas such as **game theory and behavioural economics**, issues concerning the world of **money and banking**, core ideas of **finance and stock markets** as well as political and social contexts drawing on topical examples from the world around us. Overall, the academic sessions will help them to **think like an economist** and will provide a useful insight into the way economics is taught at university level in the UK.

A TASTE OF SOCIAL SCIENCES

This course will give students an introduction to some of our top subjects at Warwick and includes Law, Philosophy, Psychology and Education Studies.

In **Law** the students will learn about how Laws are made, who makes them and why they look the way they do. The **Psychology** taster will introduce you to the way that the study of Psychology uncovers the 'secrets' behind human behaviour at degree level, the techniques used by psychological scientists, and the brain and body structures that make us act the way we do. **Philosophy** will impart important skills and abilities in critical reasoning and reflection to help students to progress in answering big questions about the conscious mind, ethical principles, free will and political justice. In the **Education Studies** lectures, the group will consider education as an instrument for social mobility, in addition to providing an insight of what it is like to engage in Education Studies at university level.

"Psychology can provide the ideal scientific backdrop for exploration of human behaviour more broadly. Sitting alongside the social sciences on one side, and the natural sciences on the other- Psychology blends methodological rigour and scientific understanding with behavioural insight, creating a discipline that can inform and underpin many others (e.g., medicine, education, engineering, political science etc.). This session will give a snapshot of how these approaches fit together, providing a rich and challenging academic experience that relates directly to the real world beyond the classroom."

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

In these sessions, students will focus on important skills such as effective listening and delivering presentations. The sessions will complement the academic learning so students will get an opportunity to apply some of the new knowledge that they have learnt in an interactive way. On the final day of the academic course, students will work in small teams to deliver a presentation to the wider group.

GUEST LECTURES

The Pre-University Summer School students also benefit from two exciting two guest lectures. These talks cover a range of topics to broaden the students' education, insights and views as well as a chance to engage with the speakers, ask questions and debate the topics they discuss.

PREPARING FOR UNIVERSITY IN THE UK

The Summer School includes sessions which will help students to prepare for studying in the UK. There will be a session on applying to University in the UK, a useful workshop on writing a personal statement and a visit to another top university when we are in London. Living and studying on the Warwick campus alongside Warwick students and experiencing teaching from a top UK university will also give our pre-university students an insight into life and undergraduate study in the UK.

All students will receive a certificate of attendance from the University of Warwick.

OUR MENTORS

A key part of the programme are our fantastic team of student mentors who are all existing Warwick students. Our previous summer school students have told us that one of the main highlights of the programme was the opportunity to spend time with our mentors.

WHAT DO OUR MENTORS DO?

Each pre-university summer school will be allocated a mentor (one student mentor per group of 12 students). A key part of their role is **safeguarding** and **well-being**, and making sure that our students are **happy on our campus**. They live alongside the students in halls of residence offering **24 hour support**.

Another key part of their role is providing a real insight into life as a student at Warwick. Our mentors are selected through a vigorous process and can therefore offer pre-university students informal advice on **university subject choices, extra-curricular activities, internships, volunteering** and **taking a year abroad**.

They also contribute to the social programme, and as well as accompanying the pre-university students on the off-campus trips and to the formal social events, they arrange lots of **informal entertainment and activities** outside of the lecture room too to help students to relax and feel at home on campus. In the past these have included **scavenger hunts** across campus, **board and card game evenings, sports tournaments** as well as **group projects** aimed to helping the pre-university students develop their soft-skills.

Our ambassadors are selected through a rigorous recruitment process, they are trained in safe-guarding, emergency first aid and are also fully DBS checked.

After graduating from Warwick in 2020, she took a position with Teach First, teaching maths.

EXPERIENCE LIFE ON A CAMPUS UNIVERSITY

With our programme our students will not only gain further understanding and new academic perspectives, but they will also get a real taste of university life by living on the beautiful and self-contained Warwick campus. Our induction programme includes a full campus tour for the students to get acquainted with their surroundings. The Warwick campus really does have everything to make students feel at home.

1. ACCOMMODATION

Students will be accommodated in our Sherbourne residences in single-sex flats along with their Student Mentor. Sherbourne boasts large en-suite rooms, modern kitchens and comfortable communal areas for students to relax in.



2. OUTDOOR SPACES

Warwick has a huge amount of green space including lakes, woodlands and open fields, an outdoor activity zone and lots of wildlife too (including a famous campus cat). There will be plenty of spare time in the evenings for students to explore.



3. FOOD AND DRINK

The programme is fully catered and our social programme events include a variety of menus from BBQs to Street Food to Indian-inspired food to keep things exciting and varied. When social events are not taking place students will eat in the campus restaurant. Warwick also has a variety of cafes, restaurants and a small supermarket for students to buy additional snacks and treats.



4. SPORTS FACILITIES

Warwick's Sports and Wellness Hub is an incredible space for all abilities. Facilities include a 230 station gym, a 25 meter 12 lane swimming pool, squash courts, climbing wall and a full timetable of fitness classes! Our Pre-University Summer School students have access this fantastic facility included in their fee.



SAFETY, SECURITY AND WELL-BEING

During their time at the Warwick Pre-University Summer School, the students will be looked after by a core team of staff trained in safeguarding students of this age. Key staff involved in the delivery of the Summer School will also be fully DBS* checked.

Students will also be provided with emergency contact details of Warwick staff and support services who will be contactable throughout the programme.

Warwick campus is a safe-space, and the University takes campus security very seriously with the security team working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week protecting the wellbeing of students.

*DBS stands for Disclosure and Barring Service, the organisation which undertake criminal records checks.



SOCIAL AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

The course will keep students busy academically but we want to ensure that they also have an opportunity to enjoy their time on campus and experience many of the UK's cultural highlights with their new friends. The fully inclusive programme includes a number of evening socials including a welcome barbecue, welcome event incorporating fun team building activities, a curry, quiz and karaoke night and an evening of tenpin bowling.



OXFORD:

Students will also visit the historic and beautiful town of Oxford, home to the world-famous Oxford University, stunning architecture, the Bodleian Library, Ashmolean Museum and much else besides.

We will spend the day there, and students will take part in a walking tour in the morning which will include a look inside an Oxford college, and a peak at some of the various locations used in the Harry Potter films. After a two-course lunch, the group will enjoy a guided punt along the River Cherwell taking in sights such as Christ Church College Meadows where Lewis Carroll wrote the famous Alice Through the Looking Glass, St Hilda's College, the Magdalen School Rose Gardens and the Botanic Gardens.

There will also be some free time for the students to spend with their student mentors to explore at their own pace and do a little shopping if they like.



LONDON:

Students will spend two days and one night in the UK's capital. We will stay in central London for one night in the Halls of Residence. Rooms will be single en-suite bedrooms and include towels and toiletries.

We have an exciting programme of activities and events, including a chance to experience some famous landmarks and sights including:

- A tour of the Houses of Parliament
- A spin on the London Eye
- A boat trip along the River Thames and a chance to see London from a different perspective
- A walk around Covent Garden, to see the street theatre, architecture and the chance to do some shopping

Each year, our students enjoy a trip into London's Theatre Land to see a West End show. We will enjoy a pre-theatre dinner together and then head to the show. We will announce the show in due course - previous participants have enjoyed Wicked and Aladdin!

All travel to and from London, and around the city, plus all entrance fees to attractions are covered in the course fee. Breakfasts, lunches and dinners are also included. Students will be accompanied by Warwick staff as well as the student mentors.

ADMISSIONS

ENTRY CRITERIA

Students applying for this programme must be aged 15-17. There are no subject-specific criteria but you should be a passionate and enthusiastic learner.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

All teaching is conducted in English so students must be able to demonstrate a good level of English language and comprehension. We assess students' English ability through their application and correspondence.
