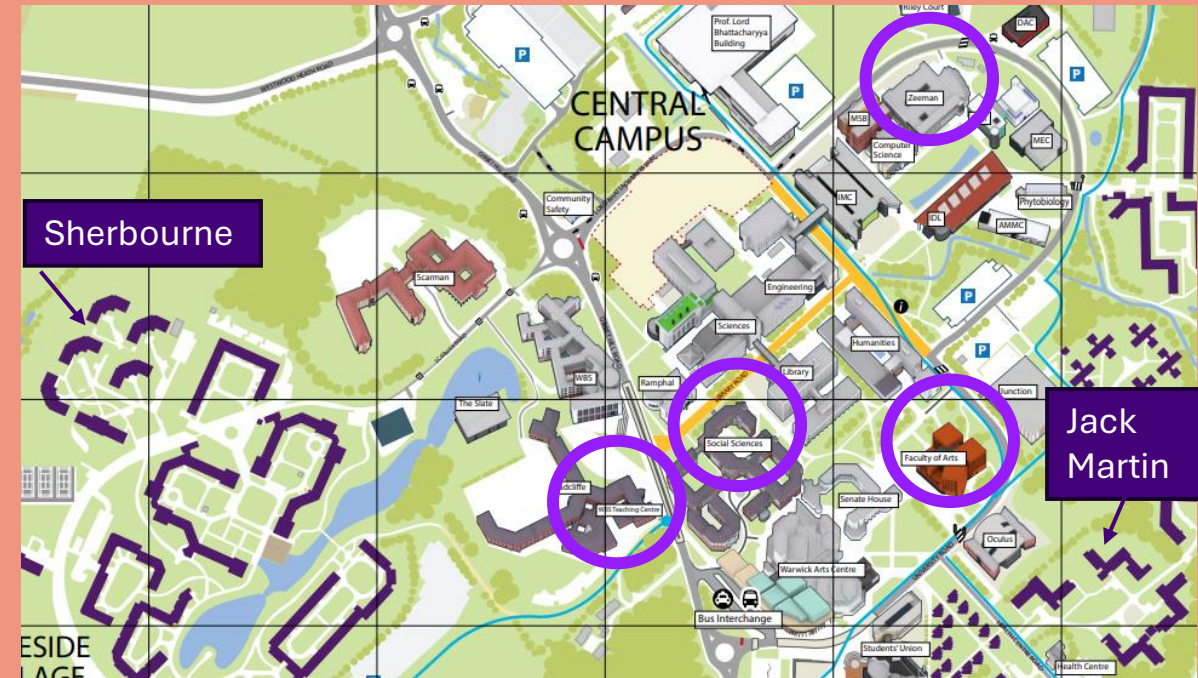

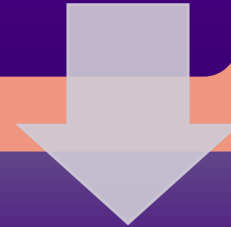

Online confidential reporting platform



Students, staff and visitors to the University can all use the platform



Disclosing to R+S using the online reporting tool **does not trigger anything formal**



Report anonymously or Report with details



We cannot contact someone if they have made an anonymous report



We are a reporter-led service and won't force someone to make a formal complaint if they don't want to



We also signpost to external and internal support services
