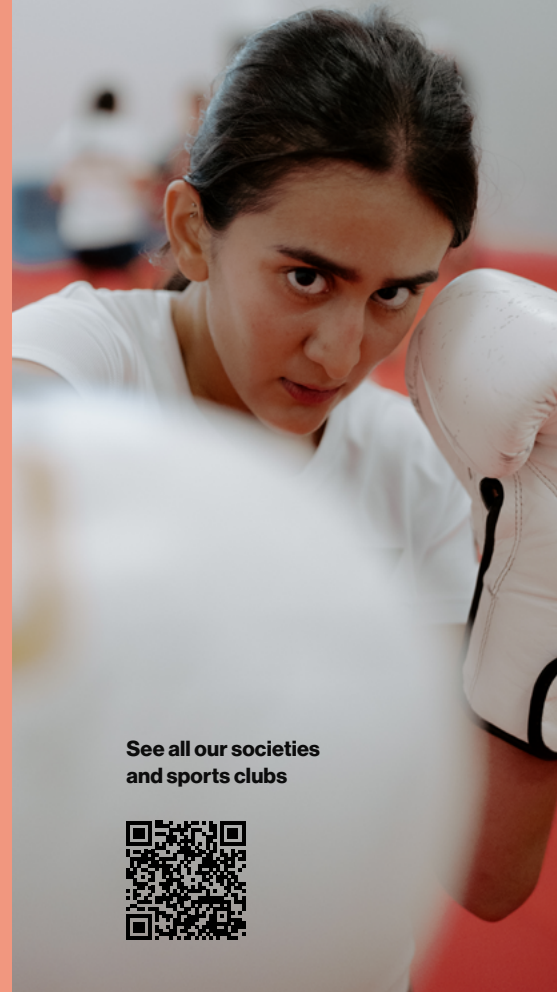

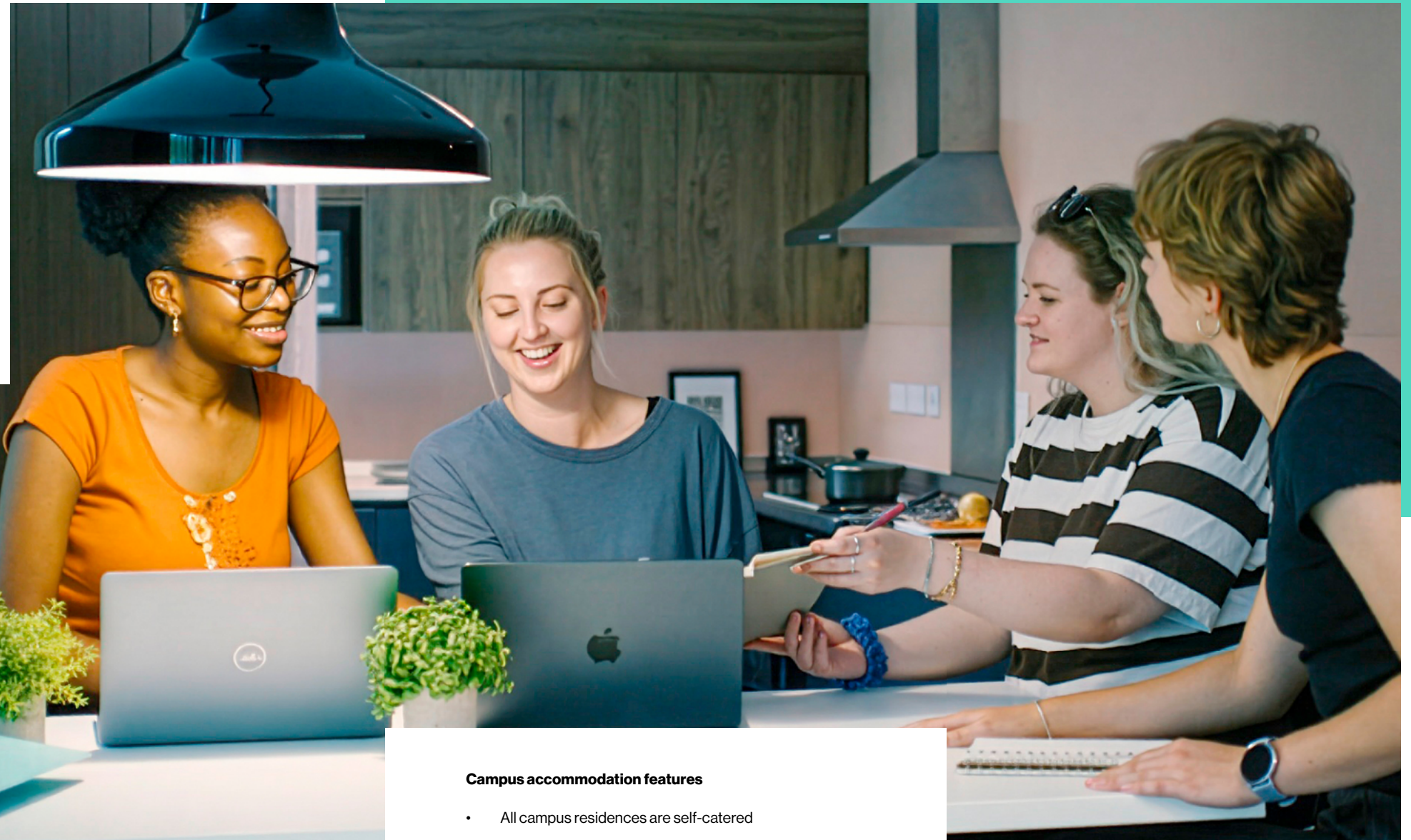

Accommodation

Starting university may mean living away from home for the first time.

At different points during your time at Warwick, you may want to fully focus and immerse yourself in your studies. You'll often want to be close to like-minded students, or the friends you hang out with. Sometimes, you'll simply want to head home to a space in which you feel comfortable.

Accommodation Guarantee

We guarantee university-allocated accommodation for all new full-time first year undergraduates, provided that you've accepted an offer from Warwick as your 'firm' (first) choice*

Eligible first-year undergraduate students who meet all our conditions will be guaranteed university-allocated accommodation. This room may be on campus or with one of our off-campus partnership providers.

**This guarantee is applicable for the 2026/27 academic year and may change in future years. Please check our Allocation Principles on our website for up to date information before you apply. You must meet the criteria and apply for accommodation by the deadline noted. Please note, the guarantee does not apply to candidates for either the MBChB (a graduate-entry course) or Degree Apprenticeship courses.*



Campus accommodation features

- All campus residences are self-catered
- Approx. 7,000 rooms to suit different budgets with shared bathroom and en-suite room options
- Residential Community Team (RCT) will help you settle in, make friends and offer support. The team also host free social events throughout the year
- Community Safety Team available 24/7
- If you have specific accommodation requirements, we can help to support your needs
- No application fee, deposit or guarantor required
- Utility bills, WiFi and contents insurance included in your rent
- Cleaning service included in most residences with on-site maintenance

After your first year

- Most of our students live off campus in the local area (Coventry, Leamington Spa or Kenilworth) but we do have a limited number of rooms on campus available
- Students with specific accommodation requirements are prioritised to live on campus, however you'll need to ensure you are supported by Wellbeing and Student Support
- To find accommodation off campus, use Warwick Studentpad to browse properties, chat to students and liaise with landlords
- Our accommodation team and Warwick Students' Union provide housing guidance and support to help you understand all your accommodation options

Applying to Warwick

You can apply for undergraduate courses through Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). Explore our applying pages online for the latest information, including how to apply, key deadlines and personal statement guidance.

We welcome applications from candidates taking different qualifications such as: Access to HE Diploma, BTEC, Scottish Advanced Higher and Welsh Baccalaureate. We also consider a wide range of overseas qualifications. You can find the full list of overseas qualifications we accept in the entry requirements section on our course pages online.

Contextual offers

We're committed to supporting students from diverse and under-represented backgrounds. Our contextual admissions approach considers educational and individual contexts to provide a rounded understanding of each applicant's academic potential and achievement. This ensures that we fully consider talented applicants from all backgrounds.

How to apply





Application timeline

March to June 2026: Plan ahead

Think carefully about your options, research universities and courses, go to Open Days if you can, and gather ideas for your Personal Statement. Register with UCAS if you haven't already done so.

September 2026: Start preparing your UCAS application

Applications can be submitted via UCAS from 1 September 2026 onwards. You can select up to five courses to apply to (there is no order of preference at this stage). Please note there is an application fee via UCAS.

January 2027: Complete your application

To guarantee your application fair consideration, you need to submit your application (including academic reference) by 13 January 2027. You will receive a decision on your application no later than 12 May 2027 if you apply by 13 January 2027.

May to June 2027: Reply to your offers on UCAS

Once you have received decisions from all the courses you applied to, you must choose one 'firm' (first) choice and one 'insurance' (second) choice offer. UCAS will confirm your individual deadline to reply.

July 2027: Final deadline for outstanding information

We must have received all your outstanding results and documentation in July 2027 in order to confirm your place at Warwick.

Writing your personal statement



Applying FAQ

How important is the personal statement at Warwick?

The most important aspect of our assessment of applications is your academic performance, including both achieved and predicted grades. Personal statements are unlikely to be the single most important factor in deciding whether you receive an offer. However, personal statements may be used alongside other factors as an additional way of ensuring you are well prepared for your chosen course. Visit our website for additional guidance.

Do I need to provide a reference as part of my UCAS application?

All applicants applying to an undergraduate course via UCAS at Warwick will need to submit a reference as part of their UCAS application. The reference is a chance for your school, UCAS centre or referee to make us aware of any significant information relating to your application.

What happens after you've applied?

You can track the progress of your application online using the UCAS Hub. Please note it may take several weeks before you start receiving decisions from your chosen universities.



Fees and funding

Tuition Fees

For the 2026-27 academic year, our fees are:

Home: £9,790*

*The UK Government has confirmed the maximum rates for tuition fees for 2026-27 and 2027-28 academic years.

The University expects to increase fees for future years in line with any inflationary uplift as determined by the UK Government. The University will set the fees for 2027-28. Please check our website for updates about 2027-28 fee rates before you apply.

Overseas

Band 1 – £27,870 per year (classroom-based courses, including Humanities and most Social Science courses)

Band 2 – £35,530 per year (laboratory-based courses, plus Mathematics, Statistics, Theatre and Performance Studies, Economics, and courses provided by Warwick Business School, with exceptions)

Overseas Tuition fees for 2027-28 academic year have not been set. Please check our website for updates about 2027-28 fee rates before you apply.

The University expects to increase fees for future years in line with any inflationary uplift as determined by the UK Government. In the future fees may also change for new and continuing Overseas students. This includes students applying for 2027 entry.

Additional course costs

There may be extra costs related to your course for items such as stationery, books, materials and field trips. For details see the Fees and funding information on our course pages online.

Funding your studies

Eligibility for student finance (including the Lifelong Learning Entitlement (LLE)) will depend on certain criteria, such as your nationality, residency status, course, and previous level of study. The information below is based on the package of financial support available to students starting their course in 2026.

Tuition Fee Loan

- Eligible Home students can apply for a Tuition Fee Loan, which is not based on household income, to cover your tuition fees
- If you are an EU student and eligible for student finance, you may be able to get a Tuition Fee Loan to cover your fees
- The Loan is paid directly to the University so, if you choose to take the full Tuition Fee Loan, you will not need to set up any payments

Maintenance Loan for Home students

- You can apply for a Maintenance Loan to help with your living costs, such as accommodation, food, books and bills
- This loan is means-tested, so the amount you receive is partially based on your household income and if you choose to live at home or away from home

Part-time work

Financial support

- There are many different funding routes available, including a number of bursaries and scholarships for full-time undergraduates

The Warwick Bursary

- Provides additional financial support for qualifying Home students from lower income families of up to £2,500 for eligible students
- This bursary is paid directly into your bank account in three equal termly instalments to help with the costs of studying
- There is no application for this bursary as your details will be provided directly from the student support awarding bodies (Student Finance England, Student Finance Northern Ireland, and Student Awards Agency Scotland)

Scholarships for Home and Overseas students

- A number of scholarship opportunities are open to Home and Overseas students

Hardship funds

The Warwick IFP helps international students bridge the gap between high school and UK undergraduate study. Delivered on campus by Warwick academics, it builds strong subject knowledge, academic English, and essential study skills required for success at a UK university.

Pathway Options

Open: One-year option enabling progression to relevant undergraduate degrees at Warwick, or a wide range of other leading UK universities.

Integrated: Four-year integrated option: a Warwick degree with integrated IFP. This offer combines the IFP as year 0 to your chosen Warwick undergraduate degree, supported by a single visa for the full duration of your studies.

Returning to study

If you're looking to return to study, our Centre for Lifelong Learning (CLL) provides a range of flexible degree courses, many of which do not require formal qualifications. We consider the experience and knowledge you have gained through both your work and your life as a key part of our entry requirements.

BA (Hons) Counselling and the Psychotherapeutic Relationship

- Study one day a week for four-years to become a qualified Counsellor
- Gain experience across a range of client needs and industries through placements

BA (Hons) Child and Family: Mental Health

- Three-years full time or four-years part-time, either online or blended study in evenings and Saturdays to develop your skills and career
- We welcome your application whatever your background or experience

With a Degree Apprenticeship at Warwick, you don't have to choose. You can start your career, earn a salary, and study for a university degree — all at once, and without paying tuition fees. At Warwick, you can:

How does it work?

You'll work for your employer around 80% of the time, learning new skills on the job. The other 20% is for your university study, with a mix of on-campus classes and engaging online learning. 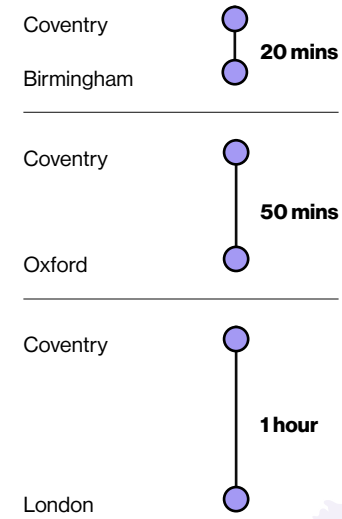
Our location

Our campus is in the centre of England

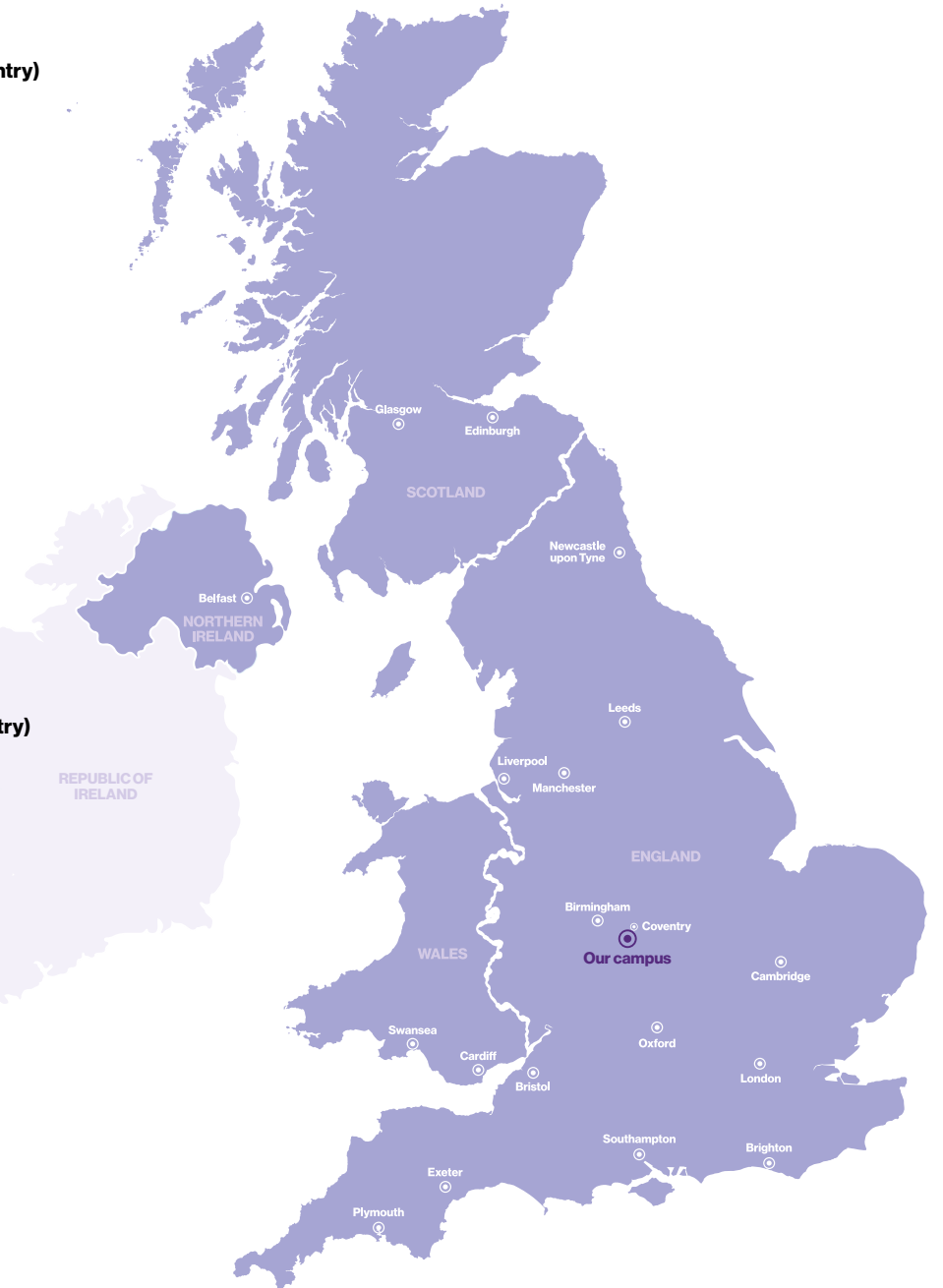
We're close to two major city centres – Coventry and Birmingham, and our excellent transport links place us just over an hour away from London by train, and close to a major international airport (Birmingham).
