We are the University of Warwick's Institutional Hub for engagement, with the strategic objectives to:


- Recognise and champion the importance of engagement and collaboration with national and regional publics and community partners

The difference we have already made

- Enabling engagers across the University to have a community and a communal voice:
 - 155 Staff and Regional Fellows working across 12 Learning Circles alongside a core team of 10.
- Enabling staff and students to engage better:
 - Over 1500 staff & 1000 students trained.
- Building Public Engagement as an important part of the Warwick student experience:
 - IATL UG Module, Public Engagement as part of URSS, Public Engagement Module Development Fund.
- Empowering staff to build and strengthen collaborations with community partners:
 - The Collaboration and Co-Production Fund: 14 projects working with 18 partner organisations, 11 artists and over 890 people.
- Recognising and rewarding great engagement by all staff and students:
 - Promotion criteria review + support workshops; WAPCE Awards
- Creating the Resonate Public events programme on campus and in the community:
 - 21-22: 150 events attended by 12000 people, involving 200 staff and 100 students, 80 artists and 60 regional organisations.
 - 22-23: So far over 4000 attendees across 39 events working with 26 regional organisations + the University's first WOW award.
